Further Study

1. As you listened to this week's sermon and read the Scripture passages, what were you convicted about? What do you believe the Holy Spirit has said to you through the Word of God? Write this down.
2. The Greek word for power is dunamis. It is used 120 times in the Bible's New Testament. If you want a document listing every use, please email Pastor Mark at mark@markaswallow.com or ask him for it and he will give it to you.

Open your Bible and do a word study on the following passages so you can see how dunamis is used elsewhere. Read Matthew 6.9-13. The word "power" in verse 13 is dunamis. Read 2 Corinthians 12.7-10. Focus on verse 9. You may have this memorized! But did you know the word "power" there is dunamis?

Read about the miracles of Jesus. Often the word translated "miracles" in our Bibles is the Greek word dunamis, which actually means power. And of course miracles are the power of God. Read Matthew 13.53-58. The words "miraculous powers" in verse 54 is dunamis. And the word "miracles" in verse 58 is dunamis. Read Acts 8.9-13. The word dunamis is used in verses 10 and 13. "Great miracles" in verse 13 is the word dunamis in the Greek New Testament.

Read Mark 5.25-34. In your Bible above the word "power" in verse 30 write dunamis. What impressed you about this true story of Jesus healing the woman with a hemorrhage?
